What is the Transitional Housing Placement Program for Non-Minor dependents (THPP-NMD)?

On September 30, 2010, Assembly Bill 12 (AB 12) Extended Foster Care (EFC) was signed into law. AB 12 allowed California to extend foster care up to age 21 for young adults who met the federal participation conditions for continued eligibility after age 18, including those served under State-Tribe IV-E agreement and supervised by probation. These young adults are referred to as Non-Minor Dependents (NMD). In Los Angeles County, THPP-NMD is an innovative program which will further the goals of the federal Independent Living Program (ILP), serving to ensure foster/probation youth are properly trained, and have attained a level of independence and self-sufficiency that allows them to exit care successfully.

GOALS

- ▶ Offer high-level independent living classes to provide the NMD with the training and skills necessary for exiting care and living independently; or remaining in care and transitioning to a Supervised Independent Living Placement (SILP)
- ▶ Help NMDs exit care with the skills and financial means to move towards independence

TARGET POPULATION

- ▶ DCFS or Probation Non-Minor Dependents (NMDs) who meet one or more of the following AB12 participation conditions:
 - Completing high school or an equivalent program
 - Enrolled in college or vocational education
 - Participating in a program designed to promote or remove barriers to employment
 - Employed for at least 80 hours per month
 - Is incapable of enrollment in school or employment due to a documented medical condition
- ▶ Aged 18 through 20 years old (up until their 21st birthday)
- ▶ Current court dependents
- ▶ Ability to live independently
- ▶ Responsible enough to share an apartment or house with another NMD

LENGTH OF PROGRAM

- ▶ The time limit for THPP-NMD participation is 36 months (3 years) or until the youth's 21st birthday, whichever comes first.

HOUSING

- ▶ Agency supervised apartments or houses throughout Los Angeles County where the NMD lives alone or with another NMD; an agency staff person might also live in another apartment or house on the same property
- ▶ A host family home where the NMD lives with a caring adult who provides supportive services and basic board and care. All housing models are completely furnished with paid utilities.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

- ▶ The THPP-NMD program offers ongoing case management to assist the NMD with maintaining and achieving their AB12 participating condition goals and preparing for living independently. The assigned CSW/DPO continues to visit the NMD and receives progress reports from the agency for each NMD. NMDs have the option of participating in their own recreational activities or attending activities offered by the THPP-NMD Agency. Each NMD receives a monthly allowance to purchase food, clothing, personal care items, and other items identified in their monthly budget. NMDs who are custodial parents might be eligible for an allowance (infant supplement) per child.

TRAINING

- ▶ NMDs are required to attend 240 minutes (4 hours) of life skills training per month. The training is intended to help the NMD develop educational, vocational, employment, and career skills. All training is designed to promote overall personal growth, and focus on money management, reproductive health, family planning, substance abuse awareness and prevention, etc.

APPLICATION PROCESS

- ▶ The THPP-NMD application is available at www.ilponline.org and is submitted directly to each agency by the CSW/DPO. The assigned CSW/DPO should contact one (or more) of the THPP-NMD agencies on the provider roster to find out about openings. Before an NMD can move into THPP-NMD, the DCFS/Probation County Program Manager (CPM) must provide authorization. The agency contacts the CPM directly to request authorization.
