What are we doing?

LA County is one of four jurisdictions chosen from across the country as part of TFSC with support and access to decision-makers at the local, state, and national level. The goal is to build coalitions to change and create policies that are informed by community and individuals with lived expertise leading and developing policies, programming, and making decisions with system partners from the inception of the idea to its implementation and ongoing ownership.

Why are we doing it?

Typical Decision-Making System executives with position power make decisions, create policies and programs, only asking communities for feedback after key decisions have been made with little or no input from those most impacted. The TFSC team does not have a prescriptive approach to these conversations. Instead, we will be co-creating our approach with community members to meet their needs and what will work best for them.
